MAYOR'S LETTER

April was a month of significant change in Occoquan that went beyond the weather. Our new Town Manager, Kirstyn Barr formally began her tenure on April 14 and hit the ground running. Please take a moment to introduce yourself to Ms. Barr and welcome her to Occoquan. Also in April, the town began installing decorative banners on the town gaslights. Long-requested by a number of town residents, and long-featured in other towns, the banners represent the collaborative effort of a number of individuals and groups. Finally, Occoquan VFW Post 7916 underwent an interior make-over and has re-opened as a non-smoking facility offering a take-out luncheon menu to the general public. If you are able, take a moment to stop by and see what the post has to offer.

Another major announcement last month was the Town's signing of a sales agreement with the NRA Foundation for the purchase of the 17.7 acres of land at the corner of Tanyard Hill Road and Old Bridge Road known locally as the Oaks III property. As many of you may recall, this property was the subject of a controversial commercial rezoning in January of 2012 by the Prince County Board of Supervisors over the objections of the Town. The Town is purchasing the property for \$300,000, subject to a conservation easement that will prevent future development. While the primary motive for the purchase is to prevent the parcel's development, ultimately the Town is considering make the property available as a passive recreation park. Closing is still weeks away, and in the meantime we are performing the relevant due diligence as quickly and as efficiently as possible.

There are a number of enjoyable events taking place in town during the month of May. On Saturday, May 10, from 1-5 p.m., over 60 artists will be participating in *Art on the Block*. Enjoy receptions and watch artists while they work at various galleries and shops. Also on the 10th, I will again start a season of leading historic tours by kayak and stand up paddleboard out of Occoquan Regional Park. Tours begin at 10:00 a.m. the second and fourth Saturday of the month, and the park charges \$10 for kayak rental. And on May 17th, Occoquan Regional Park will once again host Occoquan River Fest. Let me close this month by thanking everyone who participated in various volunteer activities last month, including the Occoquan River Clean Up and the Occoquan Historical Society Gala. - ♦ Approve marking a “drop off” space and “bike rack” space in front of Mamie Davis Park;
- ♦ Approve the allocation of funds for new entry signs at Commerce and Gordon Blvd.; Tanyard and Old Bridge; Mamie Davis Park; and three “more shop” signs;
- ♦ Approve the allocation of funds for contracts for the upcoming Occoquan Arts and Crafts Show, June 7 and 8.
